Project Description:

- Canopy-covered main entrance and 3 ft. overhangs protect garages from deep snow slides.
- Minimal windows facing the adjacent neighbor's house for privacy.
- Mountain-inspired gable ends.
- Main views of nearby golf course.
- Adjacent trees were untouched during construction.
- Roof/Second floor is separated from first floor by a dark green wood strip.
- Vertical copper cups control water/snow melt at roof valleys.
- EPS featured finish around first floor over six-inch fully insulated stud walls.
- The front entry canopy provides protection from heavy snow.
- Green wood trim accentuates the roof lines and overhangs.
- The focal point of the two-story reception/foyer is the Frank Lloyd Wright-designed panel from the Dana house.
- Second floor balcony/bridge connects the two private guest rooms.
- Below the Great Room fireplace mantel is an original Louis Sullivan-designed bronze stair riser from the Chicago Stock Exchange.
- The twin white lowers hide the fireplace and boiler flues.
